Our Irish letters of the 15th Advise that Kingdome is in Perfect peace That the Reforme of the Army is now finished That Lieut Coll Dorrington made a speech to the souldiers that the old ones should behave themselves towards the New ones as persons in the same Capasity with them not giveing occasion of discontent either on Account of their Religion or Country & that their King did allow their Religion to all of them & that should not make A diference amonge them

This weeke wee have had severall ships Arrived from Barbados Jamaica &c who Report those Countries to be in a fflourishing Condition

The Williamson Capt Warner Comander is also Arrived from E Indies Richly laden shee left the Adventure An Interloper in Surratt River in greate danger of being taken as shee Came out by Capt Tirrill who lay in the mouth of the River in one of the Kings men of warr

Last Munday the Ld Mountague Arrived from Callais in the Pacquett boate Two ffrench men of warr searched them for fugitive Protestants & found 3 on board who had not Passes whome they by force tooke out

Our letters from the Campe before Buda say many Dayly desert & Amonge them An Ensigne of the Janizaries who hath discovered the Mines the beseiged have made on the 3 Bastions to spring them in Case the Christians made themselves masters of them That on the 4th was seen A greate fire in the Towne Caused by Bombes which lasted 6 houres That in A Sally the Turks made 13 of them were taken who all Agree the Consternation was very greate they haveing already lost 1500 men The beseiged are Advanced under the walls out of danger of the Cannon & were filling the Ditch in order to Attacke it next day

L. c. 1686 London 24th July 1686

+The Instructions to the Ld Chancellr & the Rest of the Comrs for Ecclesiastical affairs are delivered & Its said their Ldpp will first open the Comission at Sergts Inne Thence to Oxford & thence to Cambridg

Our letters from Ireland say the Colledg of Dublin Nobly treated the E of Tiroconnell who Exerts the power to the full & some think his stay will not be long

Tis said the E of Oxfords Regemt is to goe into that Kingdom  $\&\ A$  Regemt from thence to supply their places here

Wee hear from the West Indies that the Dartmouth ffriggott went to Port Richo A Towne belonging to the Spaniards for wood & water but the Spaniards ffired on them & Killed some of their men & they also did the Spaniards much mischeife

Letters from the Campe before Buda say that on the 7th the beseiged sprung a mine on the Brandenburg side wherein above 150 were Buryed after which the Turks made a furious Sally

That the Bavarians had Ruined the greate Tower but durst not Post themselves there feareing the place to be undermined they haveing discovered 2 mines neer it & tooke out the Powder

That on the 13th the d of Lorraine sprung 2 mines with such good sucesse that at 7 that night he gave A Genll Assault at that Breach

with the Regemts of Staremberg Cariter & Souches being Abt 3000 seconded by many volunteers who after A sharpe dispute forced themselves thereon which being fortifyed within by A deep Large ditch Pallisadoed with Retrenchments behind it they Could Advance noe further but after 2 houres were forced to Retire lyeing all this time open to the Enemies shott in which Abt 400 soldiers were Killed & many volunteers as the Prince de Voldres & 2 Grandees of Spaine &c Also Abt 500 wounded besides many of quality, Dureing the Action the Turks sprung 2 of their mines without any Damage But when they retired the Turks sallyed out but were beaten backe with greate loss after which it was Resolved to give A Genll Assault on the 19th or 20th

The E of Tirconnell is Returneing hither from Ireland to give Account of the Affaires of that Kingdome & Army

The Ld Mountague hath kissed his Maties hand

A Pardon is Passing the seales for the Ld Brandon Gerrard Last night Sr Geo: Downings house at Hampstead was burnt to the ground & most in it lost

The quakers have given in A list of their ffreinds who have suffered & Account of the money Raised out of their estates & Its said it Amounts to above 200000 L which they say Came to the sheriffs hands or ought & Pray his Maty to order A through Inspection into the Returnes made into his Exchequer

+This night by the Holland Post wee have A large list of Christians killed at Buda & that but 2 of the English are Alive one of them being mr ffitz James his Maties naturall Son Amonge those killed was Capt Rupert son to the late P Rupert Capt Moor son to Sr Jo: Moor &c

+They write from Paris that in the late Assault at Buda there were 2000 Christians lost Amonge whome was Mounsr de Blanckfort son of the M: de Crequi whose Loss is much Regretted there

That the Brandenburghs haveing Advanced for Another Assault were Repulsed with A sally of 2000 Turks but being Reinforced they beate the Turks & killed 260 on the place & soe Closely Pursued the Rest that they entred Pell Mell into the Citty & being followed by the Imperiallists they made themselves masters of the Higher Citty in which Action A greate many fell on both sides, on the Turks 3 Bashaws were killed & on the Christians the d of Bavaria was dangerously wounded in the head & A

greate many officers killed

The Williamson from Suratt hath brought Advice that Capt Tirrill had taken the ship Bristoll An Interloper & had put one Hodden & some of his men on board her for his Matie but shee foundred in the sea & with her Rich Cargo was lost but the men saved

Wee have A further Account of the Algerines by A vessell that Came from Burdeaux to Portesmouth who mett 4 sayle of them off the Lizard Two of them of above 40 guns & the other 30 guns & well manned They Came on board her & tooke away 2 Casks of wine some Brandy The mens Cloaths Their Logg line & 1 C of Cordage & kept the master on Board 3 houres Threatening to Carry him to Algeirs he haveing noe Passe But at last sent him away but swore that whatever vessells he mett without A Passe he would send them away as good Prizes There were 5 sayle more of them Cruiseing on the Coast of ffrance

Letters from Turin in Savoy say that duke hath sent 200 of his Guards & 300 Catholicke families to the vallies of Lucerne To whome he hath given the Protestants estates Above 700 of whome are still in the mountaines & under greate Hardship

+Some say the Interview between the P of Orange & d of Brandenburgh at Cleves was for Reconcileing the Lutherans & Calvinists & that there is A good step already made & Its like to Come to A very good Ishue It being said there is An Alliance Concluded between the Kings of sweden & Denmarke The Electrs of Saxony & Brandenburgh The dukes of Hannover & Zell & other Princes of Germany

Upon which the duke ordered the Batteries to be Renewed & some

Mines to be sprung which had good effect But the souldiers were soe disheartened with the loss of their officers that the d of Lorraine was forced to lead them to the Breach with his sword in his hand & was Resolved to give Another Genll storme before the vizier Could Arrive to Put in any Succours though he Advances Apace

Yesterday the Ecclesll comrs sate (All being present but the Archbp of Canterbury) before whome the Bp of London Appeared Accompanied by dr Tenison & severall other Eminent divines

+The ffrench letters Continue to give A sad Account of the sufferings of the Protestants in all Parts of that Kingdome where many aswell ministers as others have been hanged up since the last edict

+The ffrench Ks Ague Continues & the Phisitians have ordered him the Jesuitts Powder

Wee have A Confirmation of the Christians under dunewaldt & Peterhassi beating the vantguard of the Turks & killing severall thousands on the place upon which the d of Lorraine was marched with the horse & Dragoons & some ffoot to fight the vizier leaveing the seige of Buda to Genll Caprara who was Resolved to storme it on the 11th Instant

Her Maty Comes to Towne & will stay here 3 dayes & then Returnes to Windsor where the King will meet her & Remaine there till octobr

They write from Turin that the Protestants in Piedmont not being wholly suppressed the ffrench troops are Againe Exspected in those parts. The Grand viziers Army is said to be above 50000 men of which 20000 are Janizaries. The d of Lorraine hath made A double line of Circumvallation Round his Camp & when these letters Came away they Exspected every moment to come to A Battle

The beseiged made a vigorous sally but were Repulsed

The standards & Ensignes taken were brought & ffixed in the Breaches upon which A Terrible Cry was heard in the Citty

Yesterday his Maty began his Progress & on Thursday will vissitt Kings Edgcomb where Monmouth was defeated

The E of Tirconnell is Arrived here from Ireland

the Govermt both in Church & state as by Law established & every one to Enjoy their former liberty & much more was said to the satisfaction of all people & Its beleived A Proclamation would be suddenly set forth for the quietting of Peoples minds

This day is Certain Advice that the  ${\tt E}$  of Clarendon is safely Arrived in England

His Maty haveing notice that the Ma de Abbavill had his Audience of the states did last night give Audience to Mounsr Dickvelt their Extrary envoy here

Our Holland letters say the M de Abbavill spoke with greate earnestnesse of the Kings Intention for Continuation of the treaties betwixt them & that he hoped the like demonstration would be showne by them whereupon deputies were Appointed to hear what he had further to say

Upon A motion made by him for Pardon for the English Concerned in seizeing Sr Robt Payton Its not questioned but it will be granted

They write from Vienna Teckly had some Considderable designe in hand but Genll Heuster Watched his motions

+Our fforeign letters say his holinesse hath Recomended it to his Maty of Greate Brittain to doe all the good offices he Can Abt Turneing the Truce into A Peace that soe the Christians may unite their forces Agt the Turks

Therefore humbly besought his Maty to Recall the said Mandamus His Grace waited on the King but the Request was not granted Wee have A Report that An order will Come forth to Indempnify the Printers of Roman books

They write from Ireland that the new Ld Deputy hath set forth A Proclamation that noe person depart the Kingdome without Licence & that the minds of all his Matys good subjects may be at ease & free from feares &c Assures them that noe person shall receive any of the least disturbance but by due Course of Law

This morning 3 Irishmen haveing Its said Resolved to kill the next man they mett lighted on A Grenadier whome they killed & are Comitted to the Gatehouse Some say they had a quarrell with the Grenadier Abt A woman which occasioned it

Yest began o[u]r Session at the old Bayly where mr Hoyle A Councellr of the Temple was Indicted for Buggery The grand jury upon A very full & strict enquiry into the Accusation found the bill Ignoramus soe he was discharged
