Tournaments' Glossary.

Barriers: opponents were separated by a barrier; they fought singly or in groups, usually on foot indoors; occasionally on horseback outdoors. Challenge: a summons or invitation to a tournament, proclaimed by a Herald. Lists: an enclosed area for a tournament. Running at the ring: running on horseback at a suspended ring to catch it on the point of a lance. Score-cheque for tilt: names marked with lances broken, and courses run.

Tilt: opponents were separated by a barrier; one on either side rode at one another.

Tilt-list: list of names of each contestant and his opponent.

Tourney: single or group combat with swords, either on foot or on horseback.

A score-cheque for Accession Day 1584, and a drawing of the Queen watching a tilt, tourney, and barriers, are reproduced by Alan Young, Tudor and Jacobean Tournaments (1987), 49,78.
