The dutch Ambr here hath Recd fresh letters from the states to treate here about the league whilst they treate with mr sidney in Holland & tis hoped It will be perfected In A short time

The E of shaftesbury hath another person In his Custody who Can give A further Information of the Irish buisness & upon the newes that the Conspirators are taken in Ireland the person aforesaid will be brought before the Councill

Wee had yesterday A Report that the Moores before Tangier have taken Charles & Henrietta fforts the truth of which wee Exspect by the next Cadiz letters or some ships direct from the place Those who well know the Garrison say Its Imposible for the Moores to take the Castle if they should take the Towne the said Castle being built upon A Rocke & Comanding all Round to A wonder & would soon force An Enemy out of the Towne

soe dilligent & Carefull are those persons who are Employed for sending o[u]r forces to Tangier that severall of them were shipt last

Thursday with greate quantities of Provision & Amunition & An Expresse went for Ireland to the d of Ormond to Hasten those succours he is to send thence

The spanish Ambr acquainted his Matye he durst undertake his master would Readily lend 1 or 2000 men which might be sooner Conveyed thence however his Matye might Command fforrage for his trrops for both which his Matye thanked him but makes noe use of the former

Also abt 200 German Gent who served the Emperor In the late warrs Amongst which are severall Gent of the Teutonicke order have ofered to serve his Matye Gratis In Tangier but Its uncertain whether his Matye will accept of their service The forces are drawing out hence but Its Comicall to see how those of the guards who bought their places In hopes to Enjoy Dureing their Lives without fighting A stroke are now willing to part with their places Againe both officers & others upon Easey Termes Rather then Hazzard themselves at Tangier

La Marr was not tryed for Blasphemy till last Thursday when upon the Evidence of one witness he was found guilty

+There are Endeavours used to prvent if posible sr Patience ward for being Elected Ld Mayor to which End tis said he is Returned Into the Crowne office for being A Tub preacher

The fforts at Tangier make use of sr sam Morelands Trumpetts to acquaint the garrison with their state but some Renegado English Interpreting to the moores what was spoke they are forced to speake In Irish

Our letters from fflanders of the 1st June say the short Prorogation of o[u]r Parl & his Matye dispatching soe many minesters to the severall Protestant Princes hath broken the ffrench measures & put the spaniards wholly out of fear of the ffrench meddling with them this summer

The ffrench K hath Convoked his Clergy to give him money & tis said he Intends to Advance the Jesuitts to A Capasity of being Created Popes, The Prince Palatine hath prsented A memoriall at Ratisbonne to let them know the ffrench have passed 2 sentences Agt him whereby he is Enjoyned not to acknowledg any other master then the ffrench K & Entreates the states of the Empire to let him Know how he shall Governe himselfe In this affaire

Tis said the E of Mulgrave will Comand the forces to Tangier & is prepareing for his Journey with all Expedition

There are drawne out of the standing forces here 156 horse & 672 foot for Tangier which with 600 from Ireland are the succours Intended who will be Comanded by the E of Mulgrave Attended by many persons of quality, many Comission officers of the d of monmoths Regemt who were beyond sea who have been allowed halfe pay Ever since did last weeke by the E of ffeversham offer their service to his Matye for Tangier which his Matye kindly accepted & tis thought they will goe & are to serve on Horsebacke & that horses will be provided for Them In Spaine

Tis Reported the Alcade or Generall of the Moores before Tangier told Coll Dungan that he hath A Charge from his master the K: of Morocco not to stirr from that place till he hath made himselfe master of it upon fforfeiture of his head & that though he had but A small Army at prsent there yet he had 30 or 40000 at Comand if at any time he should stand In need of them

Wee have account from Cadiz which say the Moores made A very sharpe Attempt upon Henrietta ffort & were beaten off with the loss of above 60 men A prisoner Informes they had Amongst them 13 ffrench voluntiers above 40 Messineuses neer 20 Turks from Algeir & 6 or 7 English who held A Correspondance with some people who supplied them with Powder &c, The fforts are In A very good Condition & not under any feare of being taken & by helpe of sr sam Morelands speakeing Trumpetts have Communication with the garrison which they performe In the Irish & welsh Language

Yesterday the Horse guards were drawne up In hyde Parke & 120 of them drawne out for Tangier & tis said severall of them have offered their horses & Accourrements to any that will goe In their Roome but there are abt 60 persons of quality that goe thither voluntiers

Our fflanders letters of the 7th Instant advise that the duke de villa Hermosa governour of the spanish netherlands had Recd A letter from the ffrench K In which he desired Liberty to march through those Countries with An Army of 40000 men pretending it is only to oblige the Hollanders to deliver up Mayserke & Hasselt to the Elector of Cologne & Maestricht to the spaniards which the dutch are obliged by the late Treaty at nimeghen to surrender up but now keep them upon pretence of money oweing to them by the said Princes

Phill Warricke Esqr Goes within 14 dayes for sweden, yesterday Phillip La Marr died

+This night there is An Extrary Councill at windsor to debate abt the Parliamts sitting

mr sidney hath been at windsor to give An Account of his Negotiation & the Committee of fforreign Affaires were sent for & An Extrary Councill Called there & it was debated whether the Triple League between England spaine & Holland should be Renewed but the debate is further Adjourned till to morrow when there is to be An Extrary Councill Abt it here his Matye prsent & after Councill the guards are to be drawne up before his Matye where he will draw out those officers he Intends for Tangier

To morrow the Rest of the forces Embarke & are to have their pay Advanced till the 1st July & the officers are to be Restored to their places when they Returne

+Wee have account from Tangier that on the 12th May the Charles & Henrietta fforts perceiveing the Moores had brought their mines soe neer them as that it was Imposible to prevent being blowne up Resolved to force their Passage Into the Citty & haveing Layd Traynes to blow up the fforts & broke the guns &c they made A sally In the dead of the night Into the Enemies Trenches which were A pikes Lengh deep which they with greate dificulty & Hazzard Attempted to Climbe up but the whole Army of the Moores tooke the Allarme & made greate slaughter of the English for of 180 that drew out of the fforts only 30 Escaped Into the Towne & most of them much wounded The fforts blew up dureing the ffight

The Garrison made A sally to Relieve if posible the said Gentlemen who were all voluntiers there were greate numbers of the moores Killed

The next day the Alcade Cut off the heads of the English which he sent for A present to his King & sent word to the Towne they might bury their bodies which they accordingly did Capt Trelawny who Commanded Charles ffort was Cut all In peeces They say they will have the Towne In few dayes Tis Reported they have got Amongst them some of the Engineers that beseiged Candia The K: is very much Concerned & is Angry with the deputy governour for not building A ffort or two between the Towne & the fforts which might have hindered the Moores for breakeing ground there haveing been 2000 L p Ann paid for Inland ffortifications, orders are given for drawing out 10 more out of Each troope for Tangier

On Tuesday was An Extrary Councill at Windsor where mr sidney Gave account of the defensive league between England spaine & Holland to which the 2 latter have already Agreed & is In Effect the Renewall of the Triple league & on the same Conditions In all points as mr sidney Proposed soe that his Matye will Add thereto the ffirme of his Parliamt which as Reports say will for this Reason sit next month but of this there is noe Certainty

+Wee have letters from Tangier dated 17th May which give this ffollowing account

That on the 13th at night Capt Trelawny Acquainted the Ld Inchequin In Irish by A speakeing Trumpett that they Could noe longer defend themselves & designed to make their Escape Into the Towne at 7 next morning Henrietta ffort had Capitulated 2 or 3 dayes before which was to the Towne & Charles ffort unknowne & tis judged the Moores might from the Speakeing Trumpett have some notice of the designe of those at Charles ffort

The Ld Inchequin ordered A sally to be made to divert the Enemy & Clear the Trenches & on the 14th at 7 In the morning they quitted Charles ffort being 176 men & Capt Trelawnies little boy & got well over 2 or 3 Trenches but that next the towne being 14 ffoot deep with water & durt In the Bottom only 39 Escaped over the Rest being Cut In peeces In the greate Trench save 14 & the little boy whome they tooke Alive the ffort blew up soon after they left it

Capt Trelawny brought up the Rear & tis said was killed helpeing up the little boy. There were 12 In st Giles ffort made prisoners of Warr & 30 In Henrietta ffort In all there were 123 slayne & 57 taken & Many of the scotch officers that made the sally out of the Towne are wounded & some mortally

The Moores are now placeing their guns Agt Pooles ffort & have Already sent severall shotts through the walls wee are useing all meanes Posible to Relieve Pooles ffort but tis Doubted it will be lost though soe neer the Gate & Norwoods Redoubt which will goe also if that goes

This morning May 18th Appeares to o[u]r sight A Battery on the Hill southwest of Pooles ffort which looks upon the Upper Castle & the governours house They have placed one gun Already 2 or 3 dayes will shew us the Effect of this

Wee fear it will not be Easy to hold any of the fforts & to all Appeareance the Towne is In Danger Except wee had men sufficient to make sallies Especially horse for want of which our men very much dread theirs

The K of Morocco hath also Beseiged Mororan A Portugall towne south of sally & have Almost starved them for want of provisions one of o[u]r ffrigotts is gone to Convoy A small Portugall Carvell with Provisions thither
